



Inaugural ANZAN EMG Workshop



Purpose:

A yearly workshop aimed at advanced trainee education to achieve Level 1 skills as set out by Neurology SAC.

Venue:

Sat/Sun 31st Jul / 1st Aug 2010. Kolling Institute of Medical Research, Royal North Shore Hospital, Sydney. Subsequently alternating with Melbourne. Organisers: Karl Ng, Mark Hersch, Richard Macdonell.

Program:

In this 2 day program, there will be a small number of lectures setting an introduction to the principles of nerve conduction and EMG, and demonstrations with the emphasis on small group hands-on teaching with experienced neurophysiologists using normal subjects and patient material.

Meeting registration: Saturday 9 am Meeting close: Sunday 3.45 pm.

Topics covered:

Testing strategy, anomalous innervation, carpal tunnel, ulnar elbow and distal lesions, unusual entrapments, medical neuropathies, myopathy including exercise tests, repetitive stimulation, limited autonomic assessment and quantitative sensory testing.
