



The Royal Melbourne Hospital MS Centre in collaboration with Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre are offering a 1-year MS and Neuro-oncology Fellowship. The position is accredited by the Royal Australian College of Physicians as non-core training in neurology.

The Royal Melbourne Hospital MS Centre is the home of an academic and clinical program supported by 8 neurologists, 2 fellows, registrar, and 4 research nurse coordinators. The program includes laboratory, clinical, applied and outcome research streams. The Cellular Therapies Program at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre is the only program in Australia offering CAR T-Cell Therapy.

The fellow will receive specialist training in Multiple Sclerosis and Neuro-oncology, with focus on diagnosis, treatment and management of neurological complications of oncological conditions and therapies, in particular CAR T-Cell therapy. The fellow will also participate in management of MS therapy in Day Infusion Centre and General Neurology outpatient clinics, and will receive training in MS and neuroimmunology – oriented clinical trials. This is a full-time clinical (50%) and research (50%) role and the fellow will develop and pursue research projects within our established research streams. Extension of the fellowship into a PhD program can be negotiated. The fellowship is supervised by A/Prof Tomas Kalincik, Dr Izanne Roos, Dr Katherine Buzzard and Dr Mark Faragher.

The fellowship is suitable for an Australian or overseas trained neurology trainee with valid registration in Australia, who has completed core years of neurology training.
