

EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST: MOVEMENT DISORDERS FELLOWSHIP

The Parkinson's Disease Research Clinic at the Brain & Mind Centre, University of Sydney is calling for expressions of interest to undertake a 12 month Movement Disorders Fellowship commencing in January/February 2020.

The position would work closely with Prof Simon Lewis and is intended to develop both clinical and research expertise, predominantly in the field of neurodegenerative Movement Disorders and related conditions. The Fellow will be working across a number of clinical trials targeting disease modification and symptomatic relief, as well as getting exposure to a range of research platforms including neuroimaging, neurogenetics, polysomnography and other biomarkers.

The Fellowship will include:

1. Movement disorders outpatient clinics
2. Experience in conducting clinical trials
3. Familiarity with device assisted therapies including apomorphine injections/infusion as well as training in deep brain stimulation programming
4. Teaching in behavioral neurology and neuropsychiatry
5. Time to develop clinical research projects

It is anticipated that the successful candidate would have completed their Basic Physician Training and will be looking to pursue a future career in Neurology or Geriatrics. The position could also be accredited as an elective year for a Neurology or Geriatrics Advanced Training program.
