Your responsibilities will include outpatient clinics, as well as inpatient and acute/afterhours service on a rostered basis. Outpatient clinics are primarily general neurology but there is an opportunity to develop subspecialty clinics with the agreement of the Clinical Director.

A subspecialty interest in neuromuscular disease and clinical neurophysiology would be an advantage, but not a requirement. You will participate in supervision of neurology junior medical staff and will have the opportunity to contribute to teaching and service development.
