Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital Stroke Fellowship

Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital is offering a one-year stroke clinical fellowship in 2024. This role will provide excellent exposure to all aspects of clinical stroke medicine in one of the busiest comprehensive stroke centres in Australia.

SCGH is the “quaternary” stroke centre for Western Australia with the components including an acute stroke team, the acute stroke unit within the neurology ward and close linkages with the Neurological Imaging and Intervention Service of WA (NIISWA) and neurosurgical service. SCGH stroke service has more than 1000 stroke admissions and is the only centre in the WA providing 24 hours comprehensive acute stroke treatment including stroke endovascular treatment and thrombolysis.

Clinical stroke fellow will have a thorough exposure to stroke thrombolysis, endovascular treatment, acute stroke brain imaging including multimodality CT, stroke unit care and outpatient TIA/Stroke clinic. There will be flexibility of attending 1-2 weekly sessions of electrophysiology (NCV/EMG or EEG) or sub-specialty neurology clinic like movement disorder clinic or epilepsy clinic.

There is opportunity to engage in clinical research, in accordance to candidate’s interests, which will be encouraged and supported. SCGH Neurology Department has close links with the Perron Institute for Neurological and Translational Science and there is opportunity to engage in clinical stroke research under guidance of Winthrop Professor Graeme Hankey and Clinical professor David Blacker.
